1. Training folders were reviewed during the audit and noted to be complete and thorough. The Division encourages operators to attend any microbiological, quality assurance, data integrity and/or ethics classes when able. Any of these topics may be included as continuing education. - 2. All data necessary to reconstruct lab results for compliance samples, including annual Proficiency Test samples and quality assurance testing, were readily available and easily traceable, due to redundant methods of recording analysis. (EPA Certification Manual, Chapter 5, Section 8.5)
- 3. The laboratory's quality assurance manual and standard operating procedures were reviewed during the audit. The manual and SOPs were last reviewed in November 2019 and should continue to be reviewed annually and revised as needed. (EPA Certification Manual, Chapter 5, Section 7.1):
