Thank you for your Aquatic Resource Alteration Permit application submitted to the Division of Water Resources on January 23, 2024. The Division is ready to begin the public notice process to allow for public comment on the proposed activities described below, and will post a public notice on our website within one week of the date of this letter (see http://tn.gov/environment/topic/ppo-water).

The Rules of the Tennessee Board of Water Quality, Oil, and Gas require the applicant to publish the enclosed public notice one time in the legal notices section of a local newspaper of general circulation. The applicant bears responsibility for any associated costs. The applicant is also required to post and maintain a state issued sign for 30 days where it is legible from a public road near the proposed activity. The public notice sign may be obtained at the Memphis Environmental Field Office (901-371-3000). Using a permanent marker, complete the blank areas on both sides of the public notice sign with the following information:

Please Note: State-issued public notification signs are available at any of the Division's Environmental Field offices.

Once the notice has been posted for the required period of time, you must provide proof the public notification requirements have been met, including proof of newspaper publication and photographic evidence of the sign. Required photographic evidence of the sign includes two photographs, one photograph demonstrating the lettering on the sign is clear and legible and one photograph establishing sign location. Proof of publication should be submitted within 45 days of receipt of this letter, failure to do so will result in suspension of application processing and possible termination of your application. We cannot take final action on your application until after the public comment period has expired (30 days after the public notice has been published).






South Elevation




North Elevation



Public Notice Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) Division of Water Resources (DWR) Notice Requesting Public Comments on Draft Permit Actions

FILE # NRS23.237

The purpose of this notice is to advise the public of the following proposed permit action and solicit comments and information necessary to evaluate the potential impact of the proposed activities on the aquatic environment.

Pursuant to The Tennessee Water Quality Control Act of 1977, T.C.A. §69-3-108 and Tennessee Rules, Chapter 0400-40-07, the proposed activity described below has been submitted for approval under an Aquatic Resource Alteration Permit and Section 401 Water Quality Certification. Section 401 of the Clean Water Act requires that an applicant obtain a water quality certification from the state when a federal permit is required. This notice is intended to inform interested parties of this permit application and draft permit and rationale, and to ask for comments and information necessary to determine possible impacts to water quality. At the conclusion of the public notice period a final determination will be made whether to issue or deny the permit.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION / PURPOSE

Proposed work is permanent and temporary impacts to two streams and three wetlands associated with the widening of State Route 222 to accommodate access to Project Blue Oval. Stream impacts due to encapsulation and fill and replacement result in the loss of 522.9 functional feet of stream and are to be offset through the Big Muddy Permittee Restoration Site (NRS23.094). Wetland fill totaling 0.036 acres in

the Lower Hatchie Watershed shall be offset at a 2:1 ratio by purchase of 0.070 credits from Hatchie Wetland Mitigation Bank. Temporary impacts to 0.111 acres of wetland are to be restored to existing conditions and monitored for two years and 1,206 linear feet of relocated stream channel will be monitored for five years.

ANTIDEGRADATION

The affected waters have unavailable parameters for habitat. As described in the accompanying permit rationale, the Department has made a preliminary determination that the proposed activity will result in no significant degradation because the applicant proposes mitigation to offset any appreciable permanent loss of resource values.

FACTORS CONSIDERED

In deciding whether to issue or deny this permit, the Division will consider all comments of record and the requirements of applicable federal and state laws. The division will consider the nature, scale and effects of proposed impacts. The Division will consider practicable alternatives to the alteration, loss of waters or habitat, diminishment in biological diversity, cumulative or secondary impacts to the water resource, and adverse impacts to unique, high quality, or impaired waters. In making this decision, a final determination will be made evaluating appreciable permanent loss of resource values and proposed compensatory mitigation to ensure the project will not result in no overall net loss of state water resources values.

HOW TO COMMENT

TDEC is requesting public comment on this proposed permit action. Obtaining a broad range of facts and opinions on Agency actions is one of the best ways to ensure appropriate decisions. Persons wishing to comment on the proposal are invited to submit written comments to the Division. Written comments must be received within **thirty days following distribution of the approved public notice materials** (including signage and newspaper ad). Comments will become part of the record and will be considered in the final decision. The applicant's name and permit number should be referenced. Send all written comments to the Division's address listed below to the attention of the permit coordinator. You may also comment via email to water.permits@tn.gov.

After the Division makes a final permit determination, a permit appeal may be filed by the applicant or by any person who participated in the public comment period whose appeal is based on comments given to the Division in writing during the public comment period or in testimony at a formal public hearing. Interested persons may request in writing that the Division hold a public hearing on this application. The request must be received by the Division within the comment period, indicate the interest of the party requesting it, the reason(s) a hearing is warranted, and the water quality issues being raised. When there is sufficient public interest in water quality issues, the Division will hold a public hearing in accordance with 0400-40-07-.04(4) (f). Send all public hearing requests to the attention of the permit coordinator at the address listed below or via email to water.permits@tn.gov. Any scheduled public hearings will be advertised through a similar public notice process.
