Comments:

Routine compliance inspection conducted by DWR staff Joellyn Brazile, Gregg Overstreet and Kaylee Sabo. Meg Anderson from Brasfield & Gorrie accompanied DWR staff on-site. The northern portion of the project area as shown on the submitted EPSC plans houses the construction trailers and equipment staging areas. This area is covered with gravel, which minimizes the potential for sediment runoff. Property generally drains to the north towards the WWTP under construction covered under TNR122630. The construction entrance/exit road as shown on the EPSC plans has been removed (since no longer in use). The area has been seeded and grass was establishing. Minor bare areas were observed. The area north and south of where the entrance/exit road was located appeared fully vegetated.

Twice weekly inspections being conducted, but part of TNR122630 inspection documentation. SWPPP is retained on-site in an electronic format. NOC will be printed and maintained on-site.

Recommendations:

- Ensure the vegetation fully establishes where the entrance/exit road was removed. Long term goal of vegetative cover is perennial vegetation.
- Ensure Notice of Coverage is maintained on-site.
- Ensure twice weekly inspection forms are completed specifically for this project. Inspections can be reduced to once per month in the areas of the project that are or become inactive and temporarily stabilized. Inspection requirements do not apply to definable areas that are or become permanently stabilized. Justification of reducing inspections from twice weekly to once per month should be included in the SWPPP.
- Ensure inspection documentation is signed by inspector and primary permittee (Brasfield & Gorrie representative).
