Dear Mr. Scalf:

The Division received your operating permit renewal application for three boilers on January 31, 2022. The information which you provided has undergone a preliminary review by the permit program.

It has been determined that the two propane-fired boilers (Source 07), each with a design heat input capacity of 6.277 million British thermal units per hour, described in your application would constitute an *insignificant activity* or *insignificant emissions unit*, as defined in part 1200-03-09-.04(2)(a)3 of the Tennessee Air Pollution Control Regulations. Specifically, the operation of each unit would result in potential emissions of less than five tons per year of each air contaminant and each regulated air pollutant that is not a hazardous air pollutant, and less than 1,000 pounds per year of each hazardous air pollutant.

Subparagraph 1200-03-09-.04(4)(a) of the Tennessee Air Pollution Control Regulations allows an existing source to receive designation as an insignificant emissions unit at any time. Therefore, the referenced source will not require a permit at this time. All applicable air pollution control regulations must still be met by your facility.
