RE: Permit-By-Rule for a Solid Waste Processing Facility, Jackson Law Applicability for TBG Maury County Permits: SWP600001589, SWP600001590, SWP600001591, SWP600001592

Dear Mr. Brian:

During the review of your Permit-By-Rule notifications for Energy Recovery (SWP600001590), C&D Recycling (SWP600001591), and MSW Recycling (SWP600001592), the Division of Solid Waste Management (DSWM) has determined that these notifications are subject to Tennessee Code Annotated (TCA) § 68-211-701 (Jackson Law). This law, adopted by the City of Columbia on November 14, 2013, requires the City to approve solid waste processor facilities prior to Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) review and approval for all facilities within one mile of the city boundary. Additionally, TDEC has been notified that on October 17, 2022, Maury County voted to adopt the Jackson Law as well.

A search of property data revealed the recent annexation by the City of Columbia of 534 acres along Monsanto Road, including Parcel Number 077 001.09. A one-mile buffer of this parcel encompasses all three permit notifications listed above in addition to the TBG Tire Processing and Reclamation Facility (SWP600001589) approved on June 21, 2022. DSWM notes that the four Permit-By-Rule submittals did not depict current City of Columbia boundaries including the annexed areas in their notification packets.

Per Rule 0400-11-01-.02(1)(c)2(vii) in order to continue to process these notifications, DSWM requires evidence of notification of and approval by the City of Columbia and Maury County for each proposal. Additionally, for the approved TBG Tire Processing and Reclamation Facility (SWP600001589), due to this newly discovered information and taking into account the City buffer was not disclosed in the permitting process, this letter serves as notice pursuant to Rule 0400-11-01-.02 (e)(3)(i) that DSWM is preparing to rescind this Permit-By-Rule's authorization to operate pending local approval in accordance with Rule 0400-11-01-.02(2)(e) 2(i) for not sub-

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mitting a complete application that included the required local approval, and Rule 0400-11-01-02(2)(e)2(iii) for failure to report the current city boundary.
