Dear Mr. Rudd or responsible official:

The Division of Air Pollution Control is completing file reviews to identify permits approaching their expiration date. It has come to our attention that permit number 974979 is due to expire on January 3, 2021.

Pursuant to Tenn. Comp. R. & Regs. 1200-03-09.02(3)(b)1., an application for an operating permit shall be filed with the Technical Secretary not more than thirty (30) days after initial start-up of an air contaminant source constructed or modified in accordance with a construction permit issued by the Technical Secretary.

Therefore, if this source has begun operations, please submit a complete operating permit application, and include a start-up certification if required by your permit. Application form CN-0730 (APC 100) and instructions are online at:

You now have the option of submitting your application via email to <u>Air.Pollution.Control@tn.gov</u>. The submittals must be signed, dated, and in PDF format. If preferred, paper documents can be mailed to the Technical Secretary at the address found on the application.

If construction or start-up cannot be completed, and forms filed with the Technical Secretary by the expiration date of your permit, a permit extension request must be submitted in writing at least thirty (30) days prior to its expiration date. Written requests can also be submitted in pdf format to the email address above.

Please ensure all conditions of this permit have been met, including other possible deadlines and record keeping requirements.
