Dear Mr. Gilreath:

Your construction permit application dated September 28, 2017, for two electroplating machines was received on October 24, 2017. Please be advised that construction or modification of the source cannot begin until you are in receipt of the issued construction/modification permit. A determination has been made that the application is incomplete for the following reason(s):

Additional information is needed as follows:

- 1. The APC 107 was not completed. The coatings were listed, but the components of the coatings and the amounts used were not listed on the appliation
- 2. The application indicates that no Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs) are present at this source. However the application also indicates that trivalent chromium is used at this source and chromium is a HAP and the amount used should be included in the application.

Please submit the additional information to the Technical Secretary at the letterhead address or email the information to <u>Air.Pollution.Control@TN.gov</u> in Adobe pdf format within sixty (60) days of receipt of this letter so that the Division can review the revised application for completeness. If additional deficiencies are identified, you will be able to correct them within the remainder of the one hundred and eighty (180) day-period that begins on the date you received this letter, as provided in subparagraph 1200-03-26-.02(4)(d) of the Tennessee Air Pollution Control Regulations.

It is the express intent of the Tennessee Air Pollution Control Board that the one hundred eighty (180) day permit application correction period is not to be construed by an applicant as permission to construct or modify a source without the permit required by Division Rules. If you fail to submit a complete application within this 180-day time period, all construction permits shall be denied and any fees forfeited.
