To Mr. Vojin Janjic:

I am extremely concerned about additional future negative environmental impacts which would be created by TVA's request for (NPDES) permit TN0005452 Tennessee Valley Authority Kingston Fossil Plant. I greatly appreciate the opportunity for public comment as I am strongly opposed, as a person who is concerned about environmental pollution, the impact on water quality from the toxic elements allowed in the water discharge for all who rely on these waters for life and livelihoods : river life, plants, animals and people including impact on groundwater and drinking water.

In 2015, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) of the Federal Government required a permit to limit toxic water pollution from coal fired plants. At that point, the EPA gave companies (including TVA) until 2023 to install new wastewater treatment technologies to significantly decrease the metals (specifically mercury, arsenic and selenium) in the water that is released into the Clinch and Emory Rivers. I realize that in 2020 the EPA rules were loosened; TVA wants to take advantage of those loosened rules in its hearing on November 22, 2021. I also understand discharge allowance will be increased of up to 10 percent volumetric bottom ash purge water discharge.

Subsequent to the prior coal ash spill clean up 50 workers died and 400 became ill. This is a signal as to the level of toxicity present. Our communities have learned a lesson.

I appeal to you to deny this request.

Thank you for seriously considering this request for the good of Tennessee, its inhabitants and the water flowing in its rivers.
